Climate Responsibilities of Business

Do companies have legal responsibilities in relation to climate change? And, if so, are these soft (law) or can companies in fact be held accountable, for instance based on human rights?

A special element to this conference is the visit of The Commission on Human Rights of the Philippines ('CHRP') to The Netherlands. CHRP will be visiting our country for one of its inquiries in relation to a climate change and human rights complaint on the issue of whether carbon producing investor-owned companies "must account for the human rights implications of climate change and ocean acidification". The complaint was filed in 2015 by representatives which include survivors of super-typhoons, such as Haiyan (Yolanda). A series of hearings and inquiries have already taken place over the course of 2018 in Manila, New York and London.
